



AMEC offers graduate study leading to a Master of Arts (MA) degree in Applied Anthropology. We focus on preparing students for placement in the public and private sectors as professional anthropologists, as well as preparing them for further graduate study. Our students have an excellent placement rate in the professional workforce and top-tier PhD programs.

Degree requirements include a thesis, an oral thesis defense, an internship, and 25 hours of graduate course work. Students specialize either in applied archaeology, including bioarchaeology, or in applied cultural anthropology.

Our <u>APPLIED ARCHAEOLOGY</u> program specializes in:

- Archaeological surface survey, remote sensing, and excavation methods; artifact analysis; public archaeology; environmental archaeology.
- Bioarchaeology, paleopathology and paleoepidemiology, and forensic anthropology.
- Cultural resource management, consulting practices, and ethics.
- Faculty expertise spans the U.S., focusing on the South, Western Europe, and the larger Mediterranean region.

The accelerated B.A./M.A. Program in Applied Anthropology (APAN) in the Department of Anthropology & Middle Eastern Cultures (AMEC) enables you to earn up to 12 hours of graduate course credit during your final year of undergraduate studies.

Once admitted, you can complete graduate level courses (6000-level) and receive dual credit for the equivalent undergraduate course (4000-level).

Applications to this program may be made as early as your junior year.

Apply in the Spring for admission in the Fall (see How to Apply). You must have completed a minimum of 60 or more hours of graded undergraduate courses at the time of application.

AMEC's Accelerated Master's Program

To apply you must:

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- 1) Be enrolled at Mississippi State University in the Anthropology BA program in AMEC.
- 2) Have completed a minimum of 60 credit hours of undergraduate coursework.
- 3) Have an overall GPA of 3.5 or higher
- 4) Submit an application packet with at least two reference letters to the Graduate Coordinator.

You must be accepted into the accelerated program prior to starting graduate courses.

If you are interested in applying to the Accelerated Program, you should contact the AMEC undergraduate coordinator and AMEC graduate coordinator prior to submitting an application.



HOW TO APPLY

Application deadlines:

- Spring admission: October 15th
- Fall admission (& admssion to the accelerated MA program): February 15th

Admission criteria:

Complete application for graduate study, statement of purpose, letters of recommendation (3), undergraduate transcripts, minimum 3.00 GPA*, GRE scores & application fee.
